## Parish Council

Here is a summary of the Parish Council meeting held on **March 27<sup>th</sup>** in the Baptist Chapel, Weston. Full minutes of council meetings are posted on the Village Notice Boards and on the Parish Council website. If anyone would like more detail or would like to read the actual minutes on any matter, please contact the Clerk, Ken Power.

**Planning and Licensing Matters:** Application S/2017/0226/TCA – Removal of trees at 9, High Street, Weston – this was reviewed but no response from the Parish Council was required

**St. Loys School parking and traffic problems – Update.** A meeting had been held at the school on 28<sup>th</sup> February with two representatives of Northants Highways. They were asked to confirm the ownership of verges alongside Astwell Road, to provide costings for creating additional parking spaces on these verges, and to advise how much of the cost can be absorbed by Northants Highways.. No response at the time of the meeting

**Finance Matters:** Accounts to-date and budget performance were reviewed and approved. Payments were approved for Clerk's salary and expenses, Rent for the Chapel, NCALC Training, Street lighting maintenance and entry fee for Best Village competition.

**St. Loys School "Forest School" Project:** Sarah Williams presented the St.Loys plans for establishing a Forest School in the area, and requested help from the Parish Council in finding a suitable wooded site. It was agreed that the Castle Mound, which belongs to the Parish Council, may be the best of the suggested sites. The Parish Council will support this project in principle, subject to the school arranging a tree survey and a risk assessment, and contacting the Forest Schools organisation for advice on next steps and taking responsibility for insurance cover and the safety of the children. (Subsequent correspondence note the site's special status as a Scheduled Monument)

**Parish Councils' Transparency Code:** Small councils like Weston and Weedon Lois with an annual expenditure of less than £25,000 will in future not be required to have an annual external audit. They will, however, be required to show transparency by publishing certain information on the Parish Council website. SNC have asked for confirmation that Weston and Weedon Lois will be compliant. As we have a Parish Council website we are compliant and require no further support to achieve the requirements.

**Correspondence** was noted from Voluntary Impact Northamptonshire (HS2), Andrea Leadsom, MP (enquiry about clubs and activities) and E.On (price rise)

### **Any Other Business**

- **Milthorpe Flooding** – Highways taking action but no dates yet
- **Telephone kiosks.** SNC have been advised that we wish to adopt those in our villages
- **Defibrillators (1).** Funds are being applied for in collaboration with the Village Hall
- **Defibrillators (2).** There is training in Blakesley on 9<sup>th</sup> May (details on page 5)
- **New village marquee** will be ordered in the new financial year.
- **Best Village competition** entry has been submitted. The judging date will be on June 5th

Ernie and his wife Evelyn are probably our oldest residents and have lived in the community for 60 years. Last year Ernie was awarded the Legion d'Honneur by the President of France for the part he played as a Royal Marine in the D-Day Invasion and subsequent liberation of France in 1944. Evelyn is also a medal holder, having been recognised for her wartime contribution as a land girl. We are very proud to have Ernie and Evelyn as our guests of honour.

This year's May Queen is **Darcey Morrell** and her attendants are **Alexa Walton & Harriet Sullivan-Roberts**. They will arrive at 12.00 in a Ford Mustang, driven Mr Mark Williams. The crowning ceremony will be followed by the traditional Maypole Dancing by the children of St Loys CEVA Academy, Lois Weedon, three of whom also designed the covers of the May Day Programme.

## What happens to the money raised by May Day ?

May Day is now in its 36<sup>th</sup> year and in that time has turned over approximately £250,000, at least half of which has been profit which has been distributed among various Village organisations. The event is one of the few Village activities that brings significant outside involvement of non-residents into the community and without this extraordinary effort and the funds it raises, the various organisations and activities within the village would need to find funding from elsewhere or might not even exist. Members of the various Village organisations participate in one way or another before and on the actual day, helping make the event a success.

After each May Day, once all the money has been counted and the bills paid, the May Day Organising Committee meet to consider the distribution of funds. It has become customary for the various Village groups in need of funding to write to the Committee to request a suitable donation. Each group that has benefited in the past from a May Day donation in the past will receive a letter inviting them to apply for any funding they require, stating the amount required and the purpose for which the money is to be used. I receive a lot of thank-you notes, for the weddings I've taken, the children I've baptized and sadly all too often for the funerals I've ministered at. But I have to admit, I'm a terrible thank-you note writer myself and it's not the notes of thanks I forget, sometimes I'm so busy I even forget to thank God.

But here in the Astwell Benefice we have a huge amount to say thank you for, not just the very special area we are lucky enough to live in, but our schools, our communities and of course our wonderfully ancient Churches.

Did you know that there has been a site of worship here in the village for over 800 years, but it is fair to say that our Church has only survived this long because of the support of its community.

From the buildings works that would have been a real community endeavour, through to all those who attend worship and help support the ministry and mission down the centuries.
